# \*\*<u>Pizza Party:</u> UPDATE!



### New Study Alert for Sunday School and Wednesday Evening Classes!

Greetings Bible Students! Starting the week after Labor Day, we'll embark on a study of Eschatology, or End Times Prophecy. This exciting study will be our Sunday School subject, and will be followed up and duplicated on Wednesday nights for our choir folks and night people who prefer later classes. It will continue through our Advent study around Thanksgiving.

The book we're using is Todd Hampson's "The Non-Prophets Guide to End Times Prophecy." It's a very entertaining approach to a very serious subject and we intend to cover it in detail over about three months, including adequate time for all your questions. You can get it pretty cheap on Amazon and if you find you can't afford it, let us know as we have

educational funds available to help.

Let's start by covering the introductory chapters in Part One. Read the first three chapters and as you do, write down any questions you might have within the scope of Part One. We'll try to cover about two chapters per class thereafter with the exception of the Book of Revelation where we'll spend at least a full class. George is sure he finally has the answers after 30 yrs. of study, and Pr. Phil will straighten us all out if he doesn't! Consider it "Point Counterpoint!" Adriane Brown has been a lifelong member of Grace Church. As is her mother, Nancy Smith. Arriving at Adriane's home, I was greeted enthusiastically by Angel, her twelve year old dog. Then Angel promptly fell asleep. Adriane has two other dogs, however, they were penned up before I arrived, as they are too rambunctious for us to carry on a conversation. Those two, Butterscotch and Ginger, are young dogs. Adriane has had dogs all her life. Cats, no.

Adriane's favorite activities are volunteering at the Food Pantry, going to Dayton Dragons' games and taking walks to parks (with the dogs). All her life, Adriane has liked walking dogs — liked that better than school, she says. Not that she didn't like school. It is just that school was a challenge for her. She had just enough learning disability that it took longer to master a subject. Her favorite teacher was Margery Mott, a Special Ed. teacher who taught Adriane to read and write.

Adriane liked science, especially environmental studies at Sinclair. That seems clear as we know she likes outdoors – grass, trees, flowers. She learned not to use pesticides and studied other ways to save the environment. She studied at Sinclair for four years right after high school. She still enjoyed school, but not nearly as much as being outside. She has a life-long friend, Kelly, who liked to chase butterflies. Adriane spent a lot of time calling out to Kelly, "Don't touch them!" Adriane has kept friends for many years, like Cynthia and Krissy from school days.

She worked security at the truck plant in Englewood, and so did Jeff Brown. She and Jeff dated for fifteen years before they were married at Grace. Jeff was seven years older than Adriane and had been married and divorced. He had three sisters, the youngest of whom is Adriane's age. The family has drifted apart now, though Adriane keeps in contact with Jeff's mom who lives in Englewood and is on disability.

Adriane was thirty-five years old when she and Jeff were blessed with a son, Daniel. Jeff's cancer was a difficult time for the family, and Jeff died when Danny was about ten years old. She says that, of course, she never expected to be a widow at the age of forty-five.

She started working in high school and only recently had to stop because of disability. Her first job was during high school, when she worked one summer weeding at Cox Arboretum. She has worked in security, housekeeping and as a dishwasher (her last paid position). She enjoyed working at Holly's (the local restaurant you all have probably visited) as a dishwasher. However, the detergent began causing problems with her skin. The rashes became so severe, she was put on disability.

Her mother has long been a Grace Church volunteer at the Food Pantry, even going beyond our church's two-month annual commitment. So it was natural for Adriane to volunteer there, also. Most church volunteers help only two afternoons a week for two months of the year. Adriane volunteers much more than that. She goes every week for the two days that the food pantry is open and goes other times when needed. Marguerite, who heads up the West Carrollton Food Pantry, needs help picking up cans and items from the county warehouse. Adriane is right there for her. She and Marguerite have become good friends. It is Marguerite that arranges to get tickets to see Dayton Dragons' games, one of Adriane's favorite activities. Adriane is active in the West Carrollton Lion's Club — a service organization with philanthropy in seeing-eye service dogs. Good for a dog-lover.

Danny grew up and moved out. He has found steady work in construction. He frequently comes by to give support to his mother. His 19<sup>th</sup> birthday was June 24<sup>th</sup> and Adriane arranged a celebration in the backyard for Danny, his girlfriend and her family and Adriane's own family and friends. Adriane's friend, Cheryl, made the red velvet cake, which is one of Danny's favorites. While Adriane would have made buttercream frosting, Cheryl's marshmallow topping was wonderful.

Adriane likes to cook (for church it is often rainbow cake and egg salad). Her mother is the frequent cook for supper. Her mother, Nancy, and Adriane's brother, Galen, come over to Adriane's home every evening for supper – bringing along their dog, Maggie. The four dogs like being together, though Maggie particularly likes the two younger dogs — especially when the family then takes them for walks. Remember, Adriane has lost her father, her husband and a brother, so the family likes being together, supporting each other.
