Persons of Grace

— Keith and Rachel Reinhart

Before letting you know much about their activities, let me describe Keith and Rachel in one word: kindness. Actually it is their eyes that told me so much years before I interviewed them. Haven't you noticed how Rachel's eyes twinkle with love and kindness — and Keith's

eyes show tenderness and kindness?

Keith had been in several denominations growing up, whereas Rachel had always been a Baptist. Her parents' strong faith helped set her course, and her father gave his two daughters Biblical names: Leah and Rachel. Rachel quickly found it good to be here at Grace because she had been told to *go where you are fed*. Keith's parents are George and Becky Reinhart, so you will not be surprised that Keith and his sister, Kimberly, were baptized when young and also attended church regularly. Keith, who attended a variety of churches because of many moves during his father's military career, was most affected by Pastor Joe Wenger in a Missionary Church as well as listening to the 700 Club over the radio. Keith was born in Puerto Rico and primarily grew up attending school in the D.C. area, whereas Rachel is from the Dayton area.

Keith and Rachel met at work. They were both working for a temp agency. Rachel was given a job that basically replaced Keith — who left to go work in AutoCAD. Keith has primarily always worked with steel — AutoCAD and welding. He liked working for temp companies because that gave him the opportunity to take time off when he needed to rest and reboot from depression. He now works fulltime in a welding company. It is a victory story we'll tell later.

Rachel has always liked working, and she draws strength from her active life. In school she liked math and science but wanted to do something with her hands. She now finds that pleasure in her office work. During high school she worked several jobs. At age 15 she had a paper route, worked after school at Kroger, then took on a job at Chick-fil-A. Rachel says, "I found three jobs too many and so quit Chick-fil-A, but that year of three jobs was the only time I earned all A's. Go figure!" Her current company has recently been bought, so she doesn't know if she will be able to continue with them. Oh, and that staying busy attitude? Rachel likes to crochet, so time at home includes prayer shawls among other projects.

Rachel's family always went on vacations and that is an important part of their marriage. She could go to the mountains *or* the beach. Since Keith's life and joy gravitates to the ocean — that is where they primarily go. Interestingly, they have been to every vacation place twice before trying a new destination. Their wedding was in Carlisle, Ohio, at Rachel's church (accidently it was on best man Steve's birthday). Two days later, on their honeymoon in Daytona Beach, they saw Steve in the area. Being friends, they spent some time together then — and have done so every family vacation since.

Their daughter, Alexis, is an active freshman at Miamisburg High School. Currently she is busy with marching band, playing the bass clarinet. I had to ask what characterizes a bass clarinet — it is larger and longer, giving a deeper sound. We could say a lot about Alexis, but will save that for her own article someday.

Keith describes himself as a prodigal son. He started drinking when a freshman in high school and paid more attention to what his friends said and did than what his parents said. He

moved to Myrtle Beach with friends and found his life spiraling downward. He married, had a son (Devon) and then a divorce. He returned to live with his parents. Nightly, his mother came into his room and prayed a blessing over him. One evening, instead of a prayer, she spoke orders to evil spirits to leave Keith. He hadn't been reading his Bible, but several nights later he did. He read Isaiah, all of it, and at 3 in the morning he felt the presence of the Lord. This strengthened him so that he was able to pray *and* read the Bible *and* stop unhealthy activities. While he still has a few times of depression, he now has tools he uses. Plus, Rachel is able to help him because she doesn't attempt to control things or apply pressure. *A victory story!*
