


# Tidings of Grace

January 27, 2022



#### Lesson of the Week 1 Corinthians 1:18

- "Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world?" God's ways are certainly not the world's ways, including the way God tells us to manage the resources He's given to us. The world says, "hold on, hold back and gather up." Jesus says to store up treasure in heaven where moth and rust do not destroy and where no thief breaks in to steal. Whose way do you think is best? What is wiser: the wisdom of the financial gurus or the foolishness of God?

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#### **<u>COUNCIL STRATEGIC PLANNING RETREAT</u> – February 11**

Your prayers are vital to its success! Dear Grace Family,

One of my favorite bible verses related to leading a congregation is Proverbs 29:18. It states: **"Where there is no vision, the people perish"** (KJV)

The footnote of the English Standard Translation of this verse gives us even more insight into the meaning of this verse. It states: "Where there is no *prophetic vision* the people are discouraged."

This verse tells us the importance of vision. A lack of vision is discouraging and even lethal to an organization.

Interestingly, the Hebrew word we translate as "vision," is in ("hazon") which has a range of meaning that includes both "securing the needful things against a foreseen need or opportunity," and "a revelatory vision granted by God to chosen messengers."<sup>1</sup>

## We see the dual nature of the vision that is required by a church as it seeks to fulfill its mission.

First, the vision must assist the organization in securing what is necessary to fulfill its mission in the face of current and future obstacles and opportunities. A deliberate strategic planning process assists any organization in assessing and acquiring what is necessary to fulfill its mission.

Second, we see that for the church, strategic planning go beyond mere intellectual, organizational, and administrative processes. A church must actively seek **to receive a vision granted by God**.

On February 11, your church council will engage in a day long retreat to begin the process of developing a strategic plan that aligns with our mission, vision, and values.

I am asking you to do two things in preparation. First, please familiarize yourself with the "Mission, Vision, Values" statement that you find printed below in the tidings.

Second, and even more importantly, I ask that you *pray daily* that your church council would hear the voice of God as it develops a strategic plan that will guide Grace over the next three years. We seek a plan that is truly from Him and not merely the result of our human efforts.

I close with one more important matter. In Habakkuk 2:2, God instructs his prophet to **"Write the vision and make it plain."** That is my hope and prayer for this process. That we will develop a clear vision, with specific goals and strategies, write it down, communicate it effectively, and faithfully execute it in fulfillment of the mission God has given to us.

I greatly appreciate your dedication to Christ and His bride as we seek to hear and then write God's strategic vision for Grace Lutheran Church.



## Mission:

To make disciples of Jesus Christ baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. (Mt. 28:19)

## Vision:

Grace is a fellowship of worshiping disciples of Jesus Christ centered on the Word of God.

Our Vision statement contains five crucial elements:

**Fellowship**: As a "family size" church, fellowship is a strength of our congregation. We regularly gather for a fellowship meal after each Sunday worship service. Time is reserved in team meetings and bible studies for this essential aspect of our life together. During these times we listen to one another's stories, joys, needs, and concerns. In doing so, we, "bear one another's burdens and so fulfill the law of Christ" (Galatians 6:2)

**Worship**: The Worship of God is central to our life together at Grace. While not a confessional document of our faith tradition, we concur with a line from the Westminster Catechism advising that the main purpose of life is to "glorify God and enjoy Him forever." As such, we endeavor to practice liturgical worship in the Lutheran tradition that glorifies God, proclaims the Word of God, and assures congregants of the promises of God. At Grace, we often say "Worship is the Most Important thing we do." This includes what happens at 10:30 on Sunday morning and extends to worship as a way of life.

**Disciples**: A Disciple is one who has fully absorbed his master's teaching. As disciples of Jesus Christ, we seek to embrace, fully absorb, and practice his truth. This is not merely intellectual ascent but instead is a transformational connection. To truly know truth is to know The Person Jesus Christ. It is to be in communion with him.

**Jesus Christ**: Jesus is Lord of all and Lord over us. The Second Article of the Apostles' Creed focuses on the person and work of Jesus Christ. Luther explains as follows in the Small Catechism:

"He has redeemed me, a lost and condemned creature, and has freed me from sin, death, and the power of the devil, not with silver or gold, but with his holy and precious blood and his innocent suffering and death.

> "He has done all this in order that I might be his own, live under him in his kingdom, and serve him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, even as he is risen from the dead and lives and reigns for all eternity. This is most certainly true."

**Word of God**: The canonical Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments as the inspired Word of God and the authoritative source and norm of its proclamation, faith and life, "according to which all doctrines should and must be judged." (Formula of Concord, Epitome, Part I).

## Values:

The following values define our life together:

#### Grace:

Grace is our first name! It is that quality of Christ which we experience in his unconditional love toward us and which we must offer to others, even with those with whom we disagree. Grace enables us to see our fellow disciple as a child of God, one who is loved infinitely by God in Christ. Grace is evidenced by our actions toward one another, our words to one another, and our words about one another.

#### Faith:

Faith is two-part, and both are equally important. The first part is belief-belief that God exists, and that He loves us and sent His Son into the world to save us. Faith isn't a vague hope that God might exist; it is a definite belief that what the Bible says about Him is true. The Bible says, "Without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him" (Hebrews 11:6).

The second part of faith is commitment—a definite decision not only to believe in our minds that Christ can save us, but to put our lives into His hands and trust Him alone for our salvation. True faith not only believes Christ can save us, but actually trusts Him to do it. The Bible says, "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith" (Ephesians 2:8).

#### Trust:

Congregations move at the speed of trust. Trust is an intentional attitude toward another, saying, "Until you prove otherwise, I will trust you, trust what you say, and trust will do what you say." As members of this congregation we are committed to being worthy of the sacred trust of one another.

#### Accountability:

Accountability is the flip-side of trust. It is the motivating mindset of those who have "bought in" to

the mission of the church. Trust and Accountability go hand in hand to make our congregation function effectively. Accountability is taking ownership of my words and actions related to the area of ministry in which I participate. It is the commitment to act in a trustworthy manner, to mean what I say, and to do what I say I will do.

#### Authenticity:

Authenticity is personal integrity in action. As members of this congregation, we seek to demonstrate the fruits of the Holy Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23) in our actions with one another and those outside of our congregation. We will be who we say we are, act honorably towards one another, and seek to build one another up in the body of Christ.

#### **Empowerment:**

The mission of the church shall be executed through empowered lay-led ministry teams. The number of ministry teams and the ministry responsibility of each team shall be designated by the church council. Ordinarily each team shall have a team leader and a council coach. (However, if the position of team leader cannot be filled, the council coach shall serve as both team leader and council coach.)

The team leader shall recruit team members from the congregation, regularly convene team meetings, preside at said meetings, report team activity to the council coach, and regularly seek the input, wisdom, and guidance of the council coach.

#### **Courage:**

Endeavoring to be a spiritual mature expression of the body of Christ, we will practice the courage to speak the truth in love. (Eph. 4:15)

As council members, we will have the courage to speak the truth in love to one another. We will raise our concerns and questions during council meetings rather than engaging in "side conversations" outside of the meeting. Once the council has decided a matter, even if we personally disagree, we will support the majority decision for the sake of the unity of the church.

As members of the congregation, we will have courage to speak the truth in love to one another. We will seek to maintain witness of our congregation in peace, unity, and purity. We will avoid anonymous communication, gossip, and speaking behind one's back. When disagreements arise, we will follow the resolution model presented by our Lord in of Matthew 18:15-20.





#### \*\*Grace Council Meeting Update

Grace Council met on Monday, January 16, 2023. Here is a summary of the key discussions and decisions.

This was our first Council meeting with our revised Council structure. We now have six Council liaisons instead of eight. The teams that have been combined (Fellowship and Prayer and Shepherding are now *Connections* and Benevolence and Evangelism are now *Outreach*) are looking for new ways to work together.

In 2022, our tithes and offerings were almost \$27,000 more than we'd budgeted for the year. In addition to that, Grace received \$38,000 in gifts designated for specific ministries or purposes. Our income exceeded our expenses by more than \$28,000. Thank you for your ongoing support of Grace and its ministries! God is good to each of us, and He is good to Grace. May we, as individuals and as a congregation, continue to be faithful stewards of all He has given us.

We have had a couple of employment issues. Sam Crouch has resigned as our groundskeeper. We will be looking for a replacement in the spring. Gisela Crouch has been out for 2 weeks with some health issues. She returned to work on Monday, January 23. Please keep her in your prayers.

The Worship and Music team would like to begin training children of appropriate age to serve as acolytes.

Our first quarter Congregation meeting will be held on Sunday, February 12 immediately after the service.


Star City Music Studios will have an open house at our new location on Saturday, February
